- 4 Years:** An intermediate certificate with at least 45% marks or A level with an equivalency certificate from IBCC Islamabad or an equivalency certificate from a recognized institute. OR The candidates having Sanvia-Khasa certificates from approved Wafaqs are allowed admission, if they fulfill the requirement defined by IBCC w.r.t 12 years qualification.
- 2.5 Years:** Candidates holding Bachelor degree or Shahadat-ul-Alia with HEC Equivalency Certificate (14 years of education) with the following two compulsory subjects: English & Pakistan Studies with at least 45% marks in annual system or AD in non relevant discipline with 2.00 CGPA on the scale of 4.00 from a recognized institution are eligible to apply. After Bridge Semester, the scheme from 5th till 8th Semester will be followed.
- 2 Years:** Candidates holding Associate Degree in relevant discipline with at least 45% marks in annual system or 2.00 CGPA on the scale of 4.00 in semester system from a recognized institution are eligible to apply. The scheme from 5th till 8th Semester will be followed.

Candidates will be required to pass an entry test or an aptitude interview conducted by the university.
